NEW BUSINESS:

1. <u>PN11-104, Parkside Tentative Subdivision Map and Planned Development Permit Modification, Barnhill</u> Drive at Iron Point Road

A Public Hearing to consider a request from Signature Properties for approval of a Tentative Subdivision Map and Planned Development Permit Modification to subdivide a .64-acre parcel into eight (8) single-family residential lots. The zoning classification for the site is R-4 PD and the General Plan land-use designation is MHD. A Mitigated Negative Declaration was approved for the original project (PN 04-638) in May 2005 in accordance with the California Environmental Quality Act. The Planning Commission will be making a recommendation to the City Council on this project. 2. PN12-150, Mercy Hospital Helistop Conditional Use Permit, 1650 Creekside Drive

A Public Hearing to consider a request from Mercy Hospital of Folsom for approval of a Conditional Use Permit to construct and operate a paved helicopter landing area (helistop). The proposed helistop is approximately 65 feet in diameter and will be located immediately east of the hospitals parking lot area and approximately 450 feet south of Creekside Drive. The zoning classification for the site is BP PD and the General Plan land-use designation is CA. The project is exempt from CEQA under Section 15302 (Replacement or Reconstruction). The Planning Commission will take final action on the project unless appealed to the City Council.
