## WHAT ELSE CAN I DO TO HELP KEEP FOLSOM LAKE AND OUR RIVERS CLEAN?

1. Let park or marina staff know if pumpouts or restrooms need service.
2. Make sure babies and toddlers wear waterproof diapers when enjoying the water. Dispose of used diapers properly.
3. When boating or camping at Folsom Lake, use the dumpstations located near the restrooms at Folsom Marina to rinse out portable toilets.
4. Get a free bilge oil kit from the Folsom Lake Marina to help eliminate oil discharges to the lake.
5. Properly dispose of any harmful chemicals used on your boat.
6. Use trash cans to dispose of non-recyclable garbage.
7. Encourage other boaters to follow these practices.

## FREE BILGE OIL KITS AT FOLSOM LAKE MARINA!

Folsom Lake Marina is offering free bilge oil kits. The bilge kit helps boaters prevent the discharge of used oil into Folsom Lake. Oil can get into the engine bilge in a number of ways.

The kit comes complete with an oil absorbent pillow (that is placed in your boat bilge) and a full-sized bucket for transporting the used absorbent back to a collection site located at the Folsom Lake Marina Snack Bar. The Marina has free replacement bilge pillows as well. Pick up your free kit today!

## KNOW WHERE TO GO!

It's very important to know where public restrooms and pumpout facilities are located along the Sacramento and American Rivers, and at Folsom Lake. It's also important to use them! Human waste contains microorganisms, like bacteria and viruses, that can make you sick and also harm fish and aquatic life. Our lakes and rivers are also a source of drinking water for millions of Californians. By using the restroom and pumpout facilities while enjoying our lakes and rivers, you'll be doing your part to protect our most precious natural resource ...**water.**



## WHAT IS A PUMPOUT?

A pumpout is a facility at local marinas to remove wastewater from your boat's holding tank. Always use a pumpout to empty your holding tank...even if you have a Type I or Type II Marine Sanitation Device (MSD).
