SUBJECT: **RESOLUTION NO. 7555 - A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO EXECUTE AN AGREEMENT WITH REHRIG PACIFIC COMPANY FOR THE PURCHASE OF SOLID WASTE CONTAINERS NECESSARY TO IMPLEMENT THE SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT PLAN'S COMMINGLED REFUSE COLLECTION PROGRAM**

BACKGROUND/ISSUE

The Solid Waste Division of the Utilities Department identified the need to purchase additional recycling, refuse and green waste containers for the new Curbside Recycling Program. Implementation of a Curbside Recycling Program will fulfill one of the elements stipulated within the City's Plan of Correction and Time Extension request submitted to the California Integrated Waste Management Board (CIWMB). Purchase of the containers will assist the City in meeting the 50 percent landfill diversion goal as required by Assembly Bill 939.

POLICY/RULE

Section 2.36.080, Award of Contracts, of the Folsom Municipal Code states, in part, that contracts for supplies, equipment, services and construction with an estimated value of \$41,750 or greater shall be awarded by the city council.

Section 2.36.100, Competitive Sealed bidding, of the Folsom Municipal Code states, in part, that supplies, equipment, services and construction with an estimated value of \$41,750 or greater shall be awarded by competitive sealed bidding.

ANALYSIS

To meet the City's needs, bids were solicited by advertising in *The Sacramento Bee* in the February 18 and 19, 2005, editions. This Request for Bid (RFB) was for a total of 18,500 96-gallon blue recycling containers; 1,500 65-gallon blue recycling containers; 6,500 95-gallon gray refuse containers; 13,500 65-gallon gray refuse containers and 1,500 95-gallon green waste containers. The bid includes delivery, assembly and distribution of containers to individual residences as directed by the City. In addition, affixing labels and educational material on individual containers as designated by the City, and collection and disposal of residual containers (approximately 4,600 containers) from individual residences is to be performed by the contractor.

The bid opening was held in the Council Chambers, on April 4, 2005 at 10:00 a.m. A total of four bids were received. The results were:

All bids include tax and shipping.

No bids were received from Folsom vendors. The low bidder is Rehrig Pacific Company of Los Angeles, CA. Staff determined Rehrig Pacific Company met the specifications contained in City of Folsom RFB U-022 and had no exceptions. Therefore, the bid from Rehrig Pacific Company was the lowest, responsive, responsible bid.

To provide flexibility to the program, staff requests that City Council approve an additional contingency purchase of 1,250 65-gallon containers at \$35.00 each and 500 95-gallon containers at \$39.00 each for an additional cost of \$68,151.88 including tax. These containers will be purchased on an as needed basis to fill customer requests for second containers.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

Funds have been budgeted in the FY04/05 budget and will be expended from account number 540-3502-432-3002.

ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW

The containers are part of the Solid Waste Management Plan for which an Initial Study and Negative Declaration were prepared in accordance with the California Environmental Quality Act.



RESOLUTION NO. 7555

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO EXECUTE AN AGREEMENT WITH REHRIG PACIFIC COMPANY FOR THE PURCHASE OF SOLID WASTE CONTAINERS NECESSARY TO IMPLEMENT THE SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT PLAN'S COMMINGLED REFUSE COLLECTION PROGRAM

WHEREAS, staff has determined the need to purchase additional recycling, refuse and green waste containers for the City's new Curbside Recycling Program fulfilling one of the elements stipulated within the City's Plan of Correction and Time Extension request; and,

WHEREAS, these additional containers are budgeted for, and sufficient funds are available, in the approved FY04/05 budget; and,

WHEREAS, staff reviewed the bid from Rehrig Pacific Company for \$1,872,433.75 and determined it met the specifications in Request for Bid, U-022, for both the type of material used and the method of construction; and,

WHEREAS, staff recommends the bid from Rehrig Pacific Company, and acceptance of the bid received from Rehrig Pacific Company; and,

WHEREAS, staff requires an additional 1,750 containers to accommodate customer requested changes in service at a cost of \$68,151.88 including tax; and,

WHEREAS, the provisions of Folsom Municipal Code, Section 2.36.100 have been complied with:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of Folsom Authorizes the City Manager to Execute an Agreement with Rehrig Pacific Company for the Purchase of Solid Waste Containers Necessary to Implement the Solid Waste Management Plan's Commingled Refuse Collection Program for a not-to-exceed price, including a contingency for 1,750 additional containers, of \$1,940,585.63.
