- WHEREAS,** the Folsom City Council recognizes that the expansion of arts and cultural activities benefits the residents of Folsom; and
- WHEREAS,** the Folsom Arts and Cultural Commission works with the community to increase public awareness, understanding of, and participation in the humanities and the arts; and
- WHEREAS,** the month of October 2005 has been recognized as National Arts and Humanities Month by the United States Conference of Mayors; and

MIKLOS, Mayor of the City of Folsom, do hereby proclaim October as ***Arts and Humanities Month*** and invite our residents to recognize the contributions of the arts to the community.
